AGENDA ITEMS

WS1 – Discussion: Corlies Avenue Parking

- Village Trustee Mohan noted this past year's changes that adjusted the parking to one side of the street only which improved traffic flow. It was brought to her attention that currently students are required to move parked cars every hour and determining what is most beneficial to the students is worth discussing. The possibility of extending permitting to students in that area was discussed. Village Trustee Mohan had completed a survey of interest with students. A change like this might require state approval. Potential processes discussed.

WS2 – Discussion: First Amendment to the License Agreement with Westchester County for Updated Radio Equipment *

- In April of 2020 the Village entered into a license agreement to enhance the ability of first responders to safely and reliably communicate with the county and each other through County Systems for public safety radio communication and mutual aid purposes. The County has received a grant and intends to update the existing mutual aid radio equipment located within the police agency at no cost to the Village.

WS3 – Discussion: Inter-Municipal Agreement with Westchester County to Provide Mobile Radios for Police Vehicles *

- Westchester County will provide mobile radios to Municipalities for installation into our municipal police vehicles. The Village entered into an IMA in 2020 concerning the mutual aid and rapid response plan for police mutual aid. The County currently operates public safety radio communications systems for various County Departments. A unified system is needed regarding local police radio communications to enhance overall communications. The County will provide mobile radios for which the Village will be responsible for installing, operating, maintaining, repairing and reprogramming at the cost and expense of the Village.

WS4 - Review: Regular Meeting Agenda Items

A motion was made by Village Trustee Mohan, seconded by Village Trustee Solomon and voted unanimously by all at 7:27 PM to adjourn into executive session to discuss collective bargaining for the Department of Public Works and the Parking Enforcement Officers and School Crossing Guards and staffing in Village Hall.
